About communion: In the Reformed tradition, communion is not just a symbolic act; it is a means of grace, bestowing comfort and guidance. Everyone is invited to take part, no matter what you believe or whether you are baptized. You are likewise free to abstain. Today communion is served at the front of the church. When the minister invites you forward, please approach the front by way of the center aisle, forming two lines. Take the bread and juice, then return to your seat by way of the side aisles. If you need to receive the sacrament in your pew, or if you simply prefer to receive it in the pew, remain in your seat, and someone will approach you with the bread and juice. The bread served in the pews is gluten and casein free.

Leader: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.
